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#### He kupu mai i te teepu tumuaki

(a word from the Principal's desk)

Kia ora koutou e te whānau,

As we come to the close of week two, I would like to thank all parents and whānau who took the time on Tuesday to connect with our teachers during the Parent Teacher Interviews. This is an invaluable opportunity for us as a school to connect with you. If you have not already, please take time to connect with your child's teachers and to ask any questions about their learning and development at school.



Last week I was given the opportunity to travel to the Bay of Islands as a part of the Māori Achievement Collaborative National Wānanga. The experience was a time of rich learning and profound reflection. Under the manaaki of Ngāpuhi we were guided through stories and experiences and much kōrero, all of which set down a wero (challenge) for us as we return to our own communities.

We have achieved much at Aparima College in terms of the success of all our learners and a deliberate effort to recognise mana whenua and the place of Māori at our school is beginning to reap rewards. This was demonstrated none more so than in the recent work of our Year 12 English class who wrote deeply personal accounts of their Turangawaewae (place they belong — my place). We have come far but have much to learn and far to go.



Students will be selecting their option for the next round of Kia Tū next week. I would like to extend my thanks to the community members who have contributed to our programme which seek to support learners to develop a sense of identity and place.

Attendance continues to be a concern for us at school and we ask for your support in making sure your child arrives at school on time each day. We were excited on Monday to celebrate 125 students who have attended school 90% or more in Term 1 and hope that at the end of Term 2 this number will be even higher. A reminder that attendance below 80% may lead to your child missing out on activities such as school camp, trips and sports exchanges. You are able to check your child's attendance via the KAMAR portal. If you are having difficulties getting your child to school, please do not hesitate to contact either their form teacher or any member of the management team; we are here to support regular attendance.

Finally, I have mentioned previously how well our seniors did in 2023 with their NCEA results. Recent articles in the ODT and Southland Express have highlighted the poor performance of Southland and Otago. I would like to reassure our community that the trends at Aparima College are somewhat against this tide, with our Level 1 students in 2023 performing better than in the previous 5 years with 77.4% achievement. We are excited for this cohort at Level 2 and would like to remind families that it is important for students to be staying ahead of their studies by putting in some work at home.




